1. Read through the whole chapter of II Timothy 3.
 - a. Highlight whatever stands out to you.
 - b. Make notes: What is intriguing you? What questions does it stimulate? What do you want to know more about?
2. There are no less than 18 hostile personality traits listed in II Timothy 3:2-5.
 - a. Using your journal or a sheet of paper, write them down in one list.
 - b. As you consider this list, do you see a common denominator to each trait? What do they each have in common?
3. Paul issues a warning to his beloved Timothy at the end of verse 5. What is the warning?
 - a. Read 1 Timothy 4:1 & 2. How does this relate to II Timothy 3:5?
 - b. In most cases we are encouraged to instruct, admonish and evangelize people, why does Paul instruct Timothy to “stay away”, “have nothing to do” with these particular people?
4. Read Ephesians 6:10-12.
 - a. Where is our strength to overcome found?
 - b. Who does Paul describe as the enemy?
5. Read II Timothy 3:15 -17.
 - a. How does Paul describe the Holy Scriptures?
 - b. List all the attributes and benefits of Scripture described in II Timothy 3:16 & 17.
6. List three ways you will apply this study in your life this week.
